Next week a group of Year 6's are taking part in an exciting peer mentoring workshop. During this course they will learn a range of techniques such as:

As we prepare for Chinese New Year celebrations in art all classes are making lanterns! The younger years focused on the design of the dragon scales. Years 4 to 6 utilised the Ang Pao packets to fold crisp lines and create symmetrical shapes. For years 7 and 8 we focused on the sequence of folds and string to bear weight culminating in a completed design.












Our passion for learning continues this week in science with students involved in investigating many different topics! KS1 went out with their excellent teachers and some magnifying glasses to investigate our natural world. Year 6 were looking at physical changes by experimenting with melting different substances, Year 3 were completing fact files on different vertebrates. Year 5 have started to think about balanced diets. Year 4 have been thinking about energy and starting to look at energy supplied by food, by measuring out sugar found in different foods. Year 7 have continued learning about food webs and started to think about the water cycle. Year 8 have finished their topic and experiments on light, mixing colours and making a Newton Wheel to provide evidence for what we know about white light!



<u>Chinese Language</u>

Combining the learning objectives with enjoyable activities ensures that learning a language becomes an engaging and rewarding journey.

Engaging students in the creation of board games serves as a dynamic and effective method for consolidating their learning. As pupils immerse themselves in the process of designing and constructing their board games, it gives them the opportunity to revisit their acquired knowledge, developing a deeper understanding of the content. When pupils played the games they have spent time crafting, it instills greatly a sense of accomplishment. Moreover, this collaborative approach encourages teamwork, communication and problem-solving skills, which are integral aspects of the learning process.



American Maths Olympiad


