Students' Reflection

"I learned that the smaller villages further away from the city center are more dependent on themselves for food and other goods. For example, on the first day of the trip to the Cu Chi tunnels, I saw how the rice papers were made by tring rice grain. People in these small villages eat more organic foods than the people I see in Ho Chi Minh City." - Joachim

"My first day in Vietnam was easily the best part of the whole trip—it was so cool! We started at the Cu Chi Tunnels, where we checked out all these clever booby traps, like the door trap, flip trap, and spin trap. They were kind of spooky but super interesting! We also saw a real decommissioned M41 tank, which made me feel like I was in a history book. After that, we went to the rice fields, where I learned how to plant rice and why teamwork is so important. They also taught us how to pick the right time and place to plant, which was trickier than I thought. Looking back, this day made me think a lot. I didn't just learn about tunnels or rice—it showed me how hard people work and how history is still all around us. I felt proud to be part of it all, and it made me want to learn more about other places and how people live." - Akira
